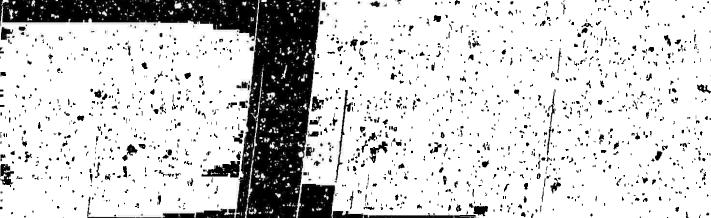
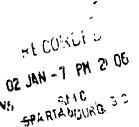

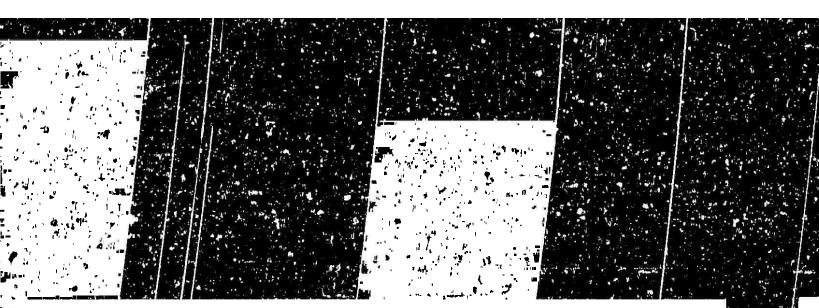

ARTICLE I

D-FFINITIONS

Section 1. "Association" shall mean and refer to Rogers Mill Homeowners' Association, Inc., its nuccessors and assigns.

Section 2. "Approved Builder" shall mean The Ryland Group, Inc., and its subsidiaries associated companier, successors, and assigns.

Section 3. "3-Laws shall mean the B). Taws of Rogers Mill Homecwhers Association, Inc.

Section 4. "Common Area" shall be that portion of the Properties so identified as Corrigion Area on the rendered survey of Rogers Mill Subcavision and which is not identified as a Lot on said survey

Section 5. "Owner" shall mean and refer to the record Owner, whether one or more persons or entities, of a fee simple title to any which is a part of the properties, including contract selier but excluding builders holding property for resale and those having such interes t merely as security for the performance of an obligation

<u>Section 6.</u> "Properties" shall mean and refer to that certain re il property bencinbefore described, and such additions thereto as may hereafter be brought within the jurisdiction of the Association.

Section 7. "Lot" shall mean and refer to any numbered plot of land shown upon any recorded subdivision map of the Properties.

Section 8. "Declarant" s' all mean and lefter to Gramling Brothers Real Estate and Development, Inc., its successors and assigns.

ARTICLE II

PROPERTY RIGHTS

Section 1. <u>Owner's Easement of Enjoyment</u>. Every Owner shall be a member of the Homeowner's Association, which riembership shall be appart: "ant to and shall pass with the ule to every Lot, subject to the following provisions:

a The right of the Association to charge reasonable fees for the maintenance of lighting, entrances, maint-manile of common areas and amenities and other reasonable expenses.

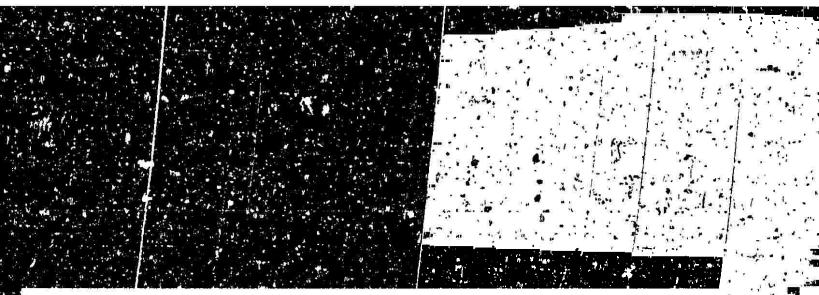
b. The right of the Association to suspend the voting rights of an Owner for any period not to exceed Sixty (60) days for any infraction of its published rules and regulations,

c. The right of the Association to decheate or transfer all or any part of the Common Area to any public agency, autionity or utility for such purposes and subject to juch conditions as may be enreed to by the Members. No such dedication or transfer shall be effective unless an instrument agreeing to such dedication or transfer is signed by 2/3rds or each class of Members and has been a corded railso, so long as there is Class B Membership, dedication of any Common Area must also be approved by the U. S. Department of Veterans Affairs, pursuant to Article K, Section 6

<u>Section 2.</u> <u>Delegation of Use</u> Any Owner may delegate, in accordance with the By-Lawe, his right of enjoyment of the Common Area to the members of his femily and their guests, his tenants or contract purchasers who reside on the Lot of such Owner.

Section 3. <u>Voting Rights</u>. The Association shall here two classes of voting membership.

<u>Class A</u> Class A Members shall be all Owners other than the Declarant and Approved Builder. Class A Members shall be entitled to one (1) vote for each Lot owned. When more than one person holds an interest in any Lot, all such persons shall be Members. The vote for such Lot shall be exercised as they among themselves determine, but is no event shall more than one (1) vote be cast with respect to any lot

<u>Class B.</u> The Class B Members shall be the Declarant and Approved Builder who shall be entitled to four (4) votes for each Lot they own. The Class B membership shall cease and be concerned to Class A membership on the happening of either of the following events whichever occurs earlier

- (a) the date on which the total votes outstanding in the Class A membership equal the total votes outstanding in the Class B membership and no Additional Property remains which may be made subject to the terms of this Declaration;
- (b) the expiration of ten (1^a) tull years after the recordation of this Electromation; or
- (c) when Declarent and Approved Builder elect by notice to the association in writing to terminate their Class B memberships.

ARTICLE III

COVENANT FOR MAINTEN ANCE. ASSESSMENTS

Section 1. Creation of the Lien and Personal Obligation of Assessments. Each Owner of any Lot, other than Declarant and Approved Builder, by acceptance of a Deed therefore, whether or not it shall be so expressed in such Deed, is deemed to covenaut and agrice to pay the Association:

(10%) percent by a vote of two-thirds (2/3) of each class of mer., were who are voting in person of by proxy, at a meeting duly called for this purpose

c. The Board of Directors may fix annual assessment at an amount not in excess of the maximum.

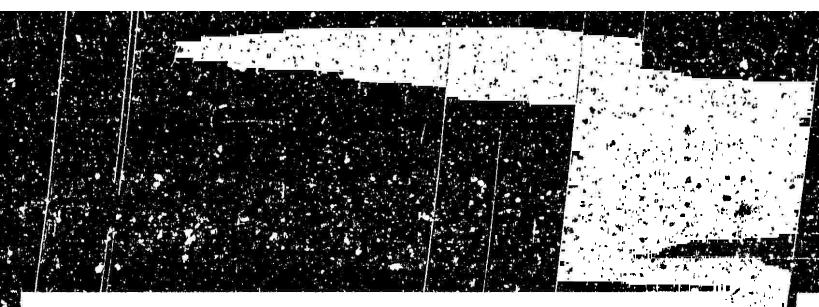

In addition to the Annual Assessments and the Special Assessments for Ъ capital improvements authorized above, the Board shall have the power to levy a Special Individual A sessment applicable to any particular for Owner (i) for the purpose of paying the cost of any construction, reconstruction, repairing replacement of any damaged component of the Common Area. including the public roads (prior () their acceptance for public maintenance) and the Recreational Facilities, if any are constructed, whether occr wored by an act or umission of such Owner, Memberr of such Owner's family, or such Owners agent, guest, employees or invitees and not as a result of ordinary wear and teal or (ii) for the payment of fines, penaltus prother charges imposed against any Owner relative to such Owner's fultire to comply with the terms and provisions of this Declaration, the By-Lawsi r any rules and regulations piorrulpated by the Association or Declarant pursuant to thisD relatation of the By-Laws. Upon the establishment of a Special Individual Assessment, the Board shall soud written notice of the amount and due date of such Special Individual Assessment to the affected Owner(s) at least ten (10) days prior to the date such Special Individual Assessment is due.

At least thirts (30) days in advance of each Annual Assessment period, the Board shall fix the anoth toftbe Annual Assessment and promptly thereafter the Board shell cause written notice thereof to be sent to every. ARCHITECTURAL CONTROL

Section I. Plen of Design Approval All residences, outbuildings and other structures initially constructed within the Subdivision by Approved Builder (collectively, "Initial

Under no circumstances shall any additional architectural approval be required as to the lineal improvements. Section 3. With the exception of the Initial Improvements describe ⁴ above, no building fence, wall or other structure shall be commenced, crected or maintained upon the Proporties. Ge shall any exterior addition to, or change, or alteration therein be made until the plans and specifications showing dx nature, kind, shape, height, materials and location of the same, shall have been submitted to and approved in writing as to harmony or external design and location in relation to surrounding structures and topography by the Architectural Committee. Any fence exceed shall only be in the yard behind the house and no fence shall be closer to the street than the rear

<u>Section 4</u>. The Architectural Commutes shall have the right to refuse to approve any plans, specifications, and/or plot plans, taking into consideration the suitability of the proposed building or other improvements, the materials of which it is to be built, whether or not it is in harmony with the surroundings, and the effect it will have on other residences already constructed

<u>Section 5.</u> Prior to the commencement of any construction, each Owner shall submit to the Architectural Committee, in duplicate, plans and drawn. ∞^{2} , in a one-eighth (1/8) scale or larger, which shall contain, at a minimum:

- a. Front ele /ations,
- h. Flooi plan;
- c The area of heated floor space;
- d. Exterior building material to include color and type of material (brick, vinyl, aluminum, cedar, etc.)
- e. Frie for trim color, and
- t. Roofing material and color.

These requirements also pertain to any alterations in Joir aduitions to existing structures.

The documents and other information required to be submitted shall be delivered or mailed to the Architectural Committee of Rogers Mill, 1° O. Box 389, Gramiling, South Carolina, 29248. One (1) complete set shall be retained by the Architecture' formmittee and the second complete set shall be returned to the upplicant, with the Architectural Committee's approval or disapproval clearity noted thereon.

Section 6. In the event the Architectural Committee, or its designated committee, fulls to approve or disapprove such plans within Thirty (30) days after they have been submitted to it, such

Houses and other dwolwing structures may not be temporarily or retrnanently occupied until completed (completion of the home is defined as having a Certificate of Occupancy). During the continuance of construction, the Owner shall require the contractor to maintain the residential Lot in a clear and uncluttered condition. Clean-up and removal of all boxes trush or debris of any kind, shall be on a regular basis. Loose trush will be cleaned up on a daily basiz. Any contractor who disregards this clean-up requirement in every respect. Contractor, who continue to disregard this clean-up requirement in every respect.

Upor: completion of construction, the Owner shall cause the contractor to immutiliately remove all equipment, tools and construction naterials from the Lot. Section 11. The Declarint expressly reserves the right to assign advise the duties, provers, functions, and approval authority set forth herein to any assignee at Declarint's sole discretion

Section 12. No approval of μ lans, location or specifications, shall ever be construed as representing or implying that such plans, specifications or standards will, if followed, result in a properly designed adsidence. Such approvals and standards shall, in no event, be construed as representing or guaranteeing that any misidence or improvement therefor will be outly in a grad weak manner. The Architectural Commutee shall not be responsible for or hable for any defects many plans or specification's submitted, $\kappa_{\rm eff}$ ed, or approved under these covenants nor for any defects in construction pursuant to such plans and specifications. The Owner shall have sole tesponsibility for compliance with the restriction and does hereby hold the Architectural Committee barmless for any failure thereof caused by the Owner's architect or builder.

Section 13 In addition to the Declarant's and the Association's right to enforce the provisions of this Declaration as wer forth in Article 10 of this Declaration, the Architectural Committee shall have the specific, nonexclusive right to enforce the provisions contained in this Article and/or in equity against the person or persons violating or attempting to violate any such provisions contained herein. In the event that the Architectural Committee, Declaration or the Association resorts to litigation to determine the propriety of any constructed improvement, to

<u>Section 14.</u> It shall be the responsibility of each Owner and tenant thereof to prevent the accumulation of litter, trash, packing states, or unkept condition of buildings or grounds on his property, or to permit accumulations which shall tend to substantially dicrease the beauty of the community as a whole or the specific area. No loose trash will be permitted to be strewn about the property at any time. Garbage containers must be keyt out of sight from the street, except during collection hours.

ARTICLE V

EXTERIOR MAINTENANCE

The Association shall maintain the Common.' reas Each Owner shall be responsible forth a maintonance of his or her dweiling and Lot. Maintenance of such dweiling and Lot shall include, without limitation, painting, replacement and care of roots, gutters, down spouts, exterior building surfaces, lawin, trees, shrubs, driveways, wallst and other exterior improvements. In the event that the Owner neglects or fails to maintain his or her *Lot* and/or the exterior of his or her dweiling in a manner consistent with other Lots and dweilings in Rogers Mill, the Arbociation may, but is not obligated to, provide such exterior maintenance asprovided above at the Owner's sole cost and expanse. Provided, however, that the Association shall first give written notice to the Owner of the specific items of exterior maintenance or repair the Association intends to perform and the Owner shall have twenty (20) days from the date of mailing of and notice within their to perform such

In order to enable the A coordination to accomplish the foregoing, there is hereby reserved to the association the right and externent to unob intracted vehicular and pedestrian access over and upon each Lot at all reasonable times to perform maintenance as provided in this Article.

In the event the Acsociation performs such exterior maintenance, repair or replacement, the cost of such maintenance, replacement or repairs shall be assessed to the Owner as a Special Individual Assessment and shall occome a lien against the Lot of such Owner.

ARTICLE VI

USES FERMITTED AND PROHIBITED

<u>Section 1.</u> All Lots shall be used for single family, residurated purposes only, and no business or business activity shall be carried on or upon any Lot at any time, except with the written approval of the Board; provided, however, that nothing herein shall prevent Declarant or Approved Builder from using any Lot owned by Declarant or App, oved Puilder for the purpose of carrying on business related to the development, improvement and sale of Lots, and provided, further that, to the extent allowed by applicable zoning laws, private offices may be maintained in dwellings located en any of the Lots so long as such use is incidental to the primary residential use of the dwellings. Except as allowed in Section 2 below, no structure shall be erected, altered, placed of permitted to remain on any Lot other than one eletached single-family residential structure with garage attached for private passenger automobile, which shall have been approved for qualification or workmanship and materials, harmony of external design with main structure, and as to location with respect to

topography and finished grade elevations.

Section 2. No tent, shack, garage, barn, storage building or other out-building shall be erected upon any Lot without approval from the Architectural Commutee and if approved, it shall not be used as a residence either temporarily or permanently. No structure of a temporary nature or an undinished house what the used as a residence and no house trailer, modular home, or mobile home, with the exception of the Approved Builder's Temporary Construction Office, shall be placed on any Lot either temporarily or permanently.

Section 3. Boats, camping unu¹⁰, s, recreational vehicles and/or similar equipment shall not be parked, kept, stored or maintained on any Lot or on the streets or common area.

Section 4. No obnoxious or offensive activity shall be permitted anywhere on the property nor shall anything be done which may become an annoyan. , musanec, or menace to the neighborhood. No Lot or any part thereof shall be used for any business, commercial, or public purpose. Business activities in the home which deliver products or survices for a fee on site are prohibited.

Section 5. No automals, livestock or poultry of any kind shall be mised, hred or kept on any Lot, except that dogs, cats orother small household pets may be kept provided that they are not kept, bred, of maintained for any commercial purposes. Such household pets must not constitute a nuisance, or unreasonable threat to any Owner or cause unsanitary conditions. The number of household pets kept and maintained shall not exceed three (3) in number except for newborn off spring of such household pets which are under nine (9) months in age-unless sppre ved in writing by the Architectural Control Committee.

Section 6. Tall shrubbery or hedges shall be trimined to reasonable limits where treation

Each Owner subject to these restrictions shall provide space for the off-street parking of automobiles prior to the occupancy of any building or structure constructed on said property in accordance with reast table standards established by the Architectural Committee Vehicles shall not be parked it, any front or side yard except in areas designated as a driveway or parking area. Vehicles in disrepair shall not be stored on the propenty. No passenger vehicles without current registration and license tags will be allowed in the suborvision or on any Owner's Lot. Vehicles being repaired out of doors must have work completed within T wenty-Tour (24) hours. Visiting guents only may use paved streets for temporary parking of their vehicles. All Owners must park in designated parking areas on their Lot. No commercial whiches over one (1) for capacity may be stored or housed on the property at any time. The Declarant may also detect vehicle Owners to park outside the confines of the property during the construction or landscaping phase of any structure.

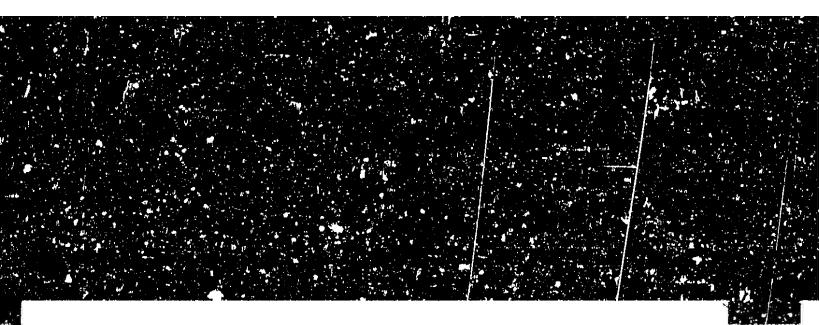

BY-LAWS OF ROGERS MILL HOMEOWNERS ASSOCIATION, I'NC.

ARTICLE I NAME AND LOCATION

The name of the corporation is ROGERS MILL HOMEOWNERS ASSOCIATION, INC., hereinafter referred to as the "Association." The principal office of the corporation shall be located at Gramling Brothers Real Estate/Development, Inc., 14960 Asheville Highway, Gramling, South Carolina 29348 but meetings of members and directors may be held at such places within the State of South Carolina, County of Spartanburg as may be designated by the Board of Directors.

ARTICLE II DEFINITIONS

<u>Section 1</u> "Association" shall mean and refer to ROGERS MILL HOMEOWNERS ASSOCIATION, INC., its successors and assigns.

<u>Section 2</u> "Properties" shall mean and refer to that certain real property described in the Declaration of Covenants, Conditions and Restrictions, and such additions thereto as may hereafter be brought within the jurisdiction of the Association.

<u>Section 3</u> "Common Area" shall mean all real property owned by the Association for the common use and enjoyment of the owners.

<u>Section 4</u> "Lot" shall mean and refer to any plot of land shown upon any recorded subdivision map of the Properties with the exception of the Common Area.

<u>Section 5</u> "Owner" shall mean and refer to the record owner, whether one or more persons or entities, of the fee simple title to any lot which is a part of the Properties, including contract sellers, but excluding those having such interest merely as security for the performance of an obligation.

<u>Section 6</u> "Declarant" shall mean and refer to GRAMILING BROTHERS REAL ESTATE/DEVELOPMENT, INC., its successors and assigns, if such successors or assigns should acquire more than one undeveloped lot from the Declarant for the purpose of development.

<u>Section 7</u> "Declaration" shall mean and refer to the Declaration of Covenants, Conditions and Restrictions applicable to the properties recorded in the Office of the Register of Mesne Conveyance of Spartanburg County, South Carolina in Deed Book 75A at Page 511. <u>Section 8</u> "Member" shall mean and refer to those persons entitled to membership as provided in the Declaration and in Article III of their By-Laws.

ARTICLE III MEMBERSHIP AND PROPERTY RIGHTS

<u>Section 1 Membership</u>. Every owner of a lot which is subject to assessment shall be a member of the Association. Membership shall be appurtenant to any lot and may not be separated from ownership of any lot subject to assessment. The voting rights of the members shall be as provided by the Declaration.

<u>Section 2 Property Rights.</u> Each member shall be entitled to the use and enjoyment of the facilities as provided in the Declaration. Any member may delegate his rights of enjoyment of the Common Area and facilities to the members of his family who reside on the property. Such member shall notify the secretary of the Association in writing of the name of the delegate. The rights and privileges of such delegate are subject to suspension to the same extent as those of the member.

ARTICLE IV MEETING OF MEMBERS

<u>Section 1 Annual Meetings</u>. The first annual meeting of the members shall be held within twelve (12) months from the date of incorporation of the Association, and a subsequent regular annual meeting of the members shall be held each year thereafter, at the day and hour determined by the Board of Directors.

Section 2 Special Meetings. Special meetings of the members may be called at any time by the president or by the Board of Directors, or upon written request of the members who are entitled to vote one-fourth (1/4) of all the votes of the Class A membership.

<u>Section 3 Notice of Meetings</u>. Written notice of each meeting of the members shall be given by, or at the discretion of, the secretary or person authorized to call the meeting by mailing a copy of such notice, postage prepaid, at least fifteen (15) days before such meeting to each member entitled to vote thereat, addressed to the members address last appearing on the books of the Association, or supplied by such member to the Association for the purpose of notice. Such notice shall specify the place, day and hour of the meeting, and, in the case of a special meeting, the purpose of the meeting. Waiver by a member in writing of the notice required herein, signed by him before or after such meeting, shall be equivalent to the giving of such notice.

<u>Section 4 Quorum</u>. The presence at the meeting of members entitled to cast, or of proxies entitled to cast, one-tenth (1/10) of the votes of each class of membership shall constitute a quorum for any action except as otherwise provided in the Articles of Incorporation, the Declaration or these By-Laws. If however, the members entitled to vote thereat shall have power to adjourn the meeting from time to time, without notice other than announcement at the meeting, until a quorum as aforesaid shall be present or be represented.

to exercise under the provisions of the Declaration. The persons receiving the largest number of votes shall be elected. Cumulative voting is not permitted.

ARTICLE VII MEETING OF DIRECTORS

<u>Section 1 Regular Meetings</u>. Regular meetings of the Board of Directors shall be held monthly without notice, at such place and hour as may be fixed from time to time by resolution of the Board. Should said meeting fall upon a legal holiday, then that meeting shall be held at the same time on the next day which is not a legal holiday, provided, however, if the Board shall agree to meet on such legal holiday, any action taken by it shall be valid and binding.

<u>Section 2 Special Meetings</u>. Special meetings of the Board of Directors shall be held when called by the president of the Association, or by any two directors, after not less than three (3)days notice to each director.

<u>Section 3 Quorum</u>. A majority of the number of directors shall constitute a quorum for the transaction of business. Every act done or decision made by a majority of the directors present at a duly held meeting at which a quorum is present shall be regarded as the act of the Board.

ARTICLE VIII POWER AND DUTIES OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS

Section 1 Powers. The Board of Directors shall have power to:

(a) adopt and publish rules and regulations governing the use of the Common Area and facilities, and the personal conduct of the members and their guests thereon, and to establish penalties for the infraction thereof;

(b) suspend the voting rights and right to use the recreational facilities of a member during any period in which such member shall be in default in the payment of any assessment levied by the Association. Such rights may also be suspended after notice and hearing, for a period not to exceed 60 days for infraction of published rules and regulations;

(c) exercise for the Association all powers, duties and authority vested in or delegated to this Association and not reserved to the membership by other provisions of these By-Laws the Articles of Incorporation, or the Declaration;

(d) declare the office of a member of the Board of Directors to be vacant in the event such member shall be absent from three (3) consecutive regular meetings of the Board of Directors;

(e) employ a manager, an independent contractor, or such other employees as they deem necessary, and to prescribe their duties;

<u>Section 5 Proxies.</u> At all meeting of the members, each member may vote in person or by proxy. All proxies shall be in writing and filed with the secretary. Every proxy shall be revocable and shall automatically cease upon conveyance by the member of his lot.

ARTICLE V BOARD OF DIRECTORS; SELECTION; TERM OF OFFICE

<u>Section 1 Number</u>. The affairs of this Association shall be managed by a Board of five (5) directors, who need not be members of the Association.

<u>Section 2 Term of Office</u>. At the first annual meeting the members shall elect two directors for a term of one year, two directors for a term of two years, and one director for a term of three years; and at each annual meeting thereafter the members shall elect directors for a term of three years.

<u>Section 3 Removal.</u> Any director may be removed from the Board, with or without cause, by a majority vote or the members of the Association. In the event of death, resignation or removal of a director, his successor shall be selected by the remaining members of the Board, and shall serve for the unexpired term of his predecessor.

<u>Section 4 Compensation</u>. No director shall receive compensation for any service he may render to the Association. However, any director may be reimbursed for his actual expenses incurred in the performance of his duties.

Section 5 Action Taken Without a Meeting. The directors shall have the right to take any action in the absence of a meeting which they could take at a meeting by obtaining the written approval of all the directors. Any action so approved shall have the same effect as though taken at a meeting of the directors.

ARTICLE VI NOMINATION OF DIRECTORS

<u>Section 1 Nomination</u>. Nomination for election to the Board of Directors shall be made by a Nominating Committee. Nominations may also be made from the floor at the annual meeting. The Nomination Committee shall consist of a Chairman, who shall be a member of the Board of Directors, and two or more members of the Association. The Nominating Committee shall be appointed by the Board of Directors prior to each annual meeting of the members, to serve from the close of such annual meeting until the close of the next annual meeting and such appointment shall be announced at each annual meeting. The Nominating Committee shall make as many nominations for election to the Board of Directors as it shall in its discretion determine, but not less than the number of vacancies that are to be filled. Such nominations may be made from among members or non-members.

<u>Section 2 Election</u>. Election to the Board of Directors shall be secret written ballot. At such election the members or their proxies may cast, in respect to each vacancy as many votes as they are entitled

(f) contract for the Association for the provision of services in keeping with the purposes or the Association; and

(g) employ attorneys to represent the Association when deemed necessary.

Section 2 Duties. It shall be the duty of the Board of Directors to:

(a) cause to be kept a complete record of all its acts and corporate affairs and to present a statement thereof to the members at the annual meeting of the members, or at any special meeting when such statement is requested in writing by one-fourth (1/4) of the Class A members who are entitled to vote;

(b) supervise all officers, agents and employees of this Association, and to see that their duties are property performed;

(c) as more fully provided in the Declaration, to:

(1) fix the amount of the annual assessment against each lot subject to assessment at least thirty (30) days in advance of each annual assessment period;

(2) send written notice of each assessment to every owner subject thereto at least thirty (30) days in advance of each annual assessment period; and

(3) foreclose the lien against any property for which assessments are not paid within thirty (30) days after due date or to bring an action at law against the owner personally obligated to pay the same.

(d) issue, or to cause an appropriate office to issue, upon demand by any person, a certificate setting forth whether or not any assessment has been paid. A reasonable charge may be made by the Board for the issuance of these certificates. If a certificate states an assessment has been paid, such certificate shall be conclusive evidence of such payment,

(e) procure and maintain adequate liability insurance covering the Association, its directors, officers, agents and employees and to procure and maintain adequate hazard insurance of the real and personal property owned by the Association;

(f) cause all officers or employees having fiscal responsibilities to be bonded, as it may deem appropriate; and

(g) cause the Common Area to be maintained.

ARTICLE IX OFFICERS AND THEIR DUTIES

<u>Section 1 Enumeration of Officers.</u> The Officers of this Association shall be a president and vice president, who shall at all times be members of the Board of Directors, a secretary, and a treasurer, and such other officers as the Board may from time to time by resolution create.

<u>Section 2 Election of Officers</u>. The election of officers shall take place at the first meeting of the Board of Directors following each annual meeting of the members.

<u>Section 3 Term.</u> The officers of this Association shall be elected annually by the Board and each shall hold office for one (1) year unless he shall sooner resign, or shall be removed or otherwise disqualified to serve.

<u>Section 4 Special Appointment.</u> The Board may elect such other officers as the affairs of the Association may require, each of whom shall hold office for such period, have such authority, and perform such duties as the Board may, from time to time, determine.

<u>Section 5 Resignation and Removal.</u> An officer may be removed from office with or without cause by the Board. Any officer may resign at any time giving written notice to the Board, the president or the secretary: Such resignation shall take effect on the date of receipt of such notice or at any later time specified therein, and unless otherwise specified therein, the acceptance of such resignation shall not be necessary to make it effective.

<u>Section 6 Vacancies</u>. A vacancy in any office may be filled by appointment by the Board. The officer appointed to such vacancy shall serve for the remainder of the term of the officer he replaces.

<u>Section 7 Multiple Offices.</u> The offices of secretary and treasurer may be held by the same person. No person shall simultaneously hold more than one of any of the other offices except in the case of special offices created pursuant to Section 4 of this Article.

Section 8 Duties. The duties of the officers are as follows:

<u>President</u>

(a) The president shall preside at all meetings of the Board of Directors; shall see that orders and resolutions of the Board are carried out; shall sign all leases, mortgages, deeds and other written instruments and shall co-sign all promissory notes.

Vice President

(b) The vice president shall act in the place and stead of the president in the event of his absence, inability or refusal to act, and shall exercise and discharge such other duties as may be required of him by the Board.

<u>Secretary</u>

(c) The secretary shall record all votes and keep the minutes of all meetings and proceedings of the Board and of the members; keep the corporate seal of the Association and affix it on all papers requiring said seal, serve notice of meetings of the Board and of the members; keep appropriate current records showing the members of the Association together with their addresses, and shall perform such other duties as required by the Board.

<u>Treasurer</u>

(d) The treasurer shall receive and deposit in appropriate bank accounts all moneys of the Association and shall disburse such funds as directed by resolution of the Board of Directors; shall sign all checks and promissory notes of the Association; keep proper books to be made by a public accountant at the completion of each fiscal year; and shall prepare an annual budget and a statement of income and expenditures to be presented to the membership at its regular annual meeting, and deliver a copy of each to the members.

(e) The Board may assign any or all of the duties of the secretary and treasurer to a professional manager at their sole discretion, provided said manager is properly bonded to perform said duties.

ARTICLE X INDEMNIFICATIONS

The Association shall indemnify any Director or Officer or former Director or Officer of the Association against expenses actually and necessarily incurred by him in connection with the defense of any action, suit, or proceeding in which he is made a party by reason of being or having been such director or officer, except in relation to matters as to which he shall be adjudged in such action, suit or proceeding to be liable for negligence of misconduct in the performance of the duty.

ARTICLE XI COMMITTEES

The Board of Directors shall appoint an Architectural Control Committee, as provided in the Declaration, and a Nominating Committee, as provided in these By-Laws. In addition, the Board of Directors shall appoint other committees as deemed appropriate in carrying out its purpose.

ARTICLE XII BOOKS AND RECORDS

The books, records and papers of the Association shall at all times, during reasonable business hours, be subject to inspection by any member. The Declaration, the Articles of Incorporation, and these By-Laws shall be available for inspection by any member at the principal office of the Association, where copies may be purchased.

ARTICLE XIII ASSESSMENTS

As more fully provided in the Declaration, each member is obligated to pay to the Association annual and special assessments for each lot subject to assessment which are secured by a continuing lien upon the property against which the assessment is made. Any assessments which are not paid when due shall be delinquent. If the assessment is not paid within thirty (30) days after the due date, the assessment shall be subject to late charges as specified in the Declaration, and the Association may bring in action at law against the owner personally obligated to pay the same or foreclose the lien against the Property and action shall be added to the amount of such assessment. No owner may waive or otherwise escape liability for the assessments provided for herein by non-use of the Common Area or abandonment of his lot.

ARTICLE XIV MISCELLANEOUS

<u>Section 1</u> The fiscal year of the Association shall begin on the first day of January and end on the 31st day of December of every year, except that the first fiscal year shall begin on the date of incorporation.

<u>Section 2</u> In case of any conflict between the Articles of Incorporation and these By-Laws, the Articles shall control; and in the case of any conflict between the Declaration and these By-Laws, the Declaration shall control.

ARTICLE XV AMENDMENTS
